If you are registered, in the upper right-hand corner of the page it will read "Welcome (your name)" or "Sign Up". If it reads 'sign up', please complete the form and choose our Chapter from the list of MOAA Chapters in the dropdown menu.

Once registered (which takes seconds), it is very easy to weigh in on important issues by returning to https://moaa.quorum.us and sending your legislators a message supporting key advocacy issues. It literally takes less than 5 minutes.

The December Luncheon will be held on 16 December at 11:30am at the Centennial Club Pub. The guest speaker will be COL Lee C. Freeman, the Commander of William Beaumont Army Medical Center. Please plan to attend and bring a friend or two.

The man was angry and frustrated that the policeman had caught him. He told the officer to give him a break since he had seen the officer at his church.

The officer did not respond, just went to the front of the car and was writing on his tablet and when he finished, he knocked on the window and gave the man the piece of paper and left.

The man thinking that it was a ticket saw that it was a note that said: I am giving you a warning, my 3 year old was killed, run over, by a speeder. Please slow down and drive safely.

When I heard the story, I was devastated because I thought that what if there had been a family in a car that was crossing and what if I had killed them or injured them for the rest of their lives.

What if I had gotten injured as well. The amount of time that I went through repenting with my Heavenly Father and my Lord is under estimated.

If we would get into a habit of stopping just a few seconds before making decisions and asking God for help, we, perhaps, could avoid a lot of mistakes in our daily lives. If we would allow our Supreme Being to guide us, life could be much more enjoyable and less stressful.







Doc's Corner Daniel Washburn, M.D.

Fall is now just around the corner. Although many vaccines can be taken anytime of the year, Fall is a common time to update vaccines, especially the Flu vaccine. Following is a brief summary of vaccines that are recommended for American adults.

COVID-19: Current recommendations for the COVID-19 vaccine are somewhat complicated and can't be fully explained in this brief article. See your primary care doctor to see if you need another COVID vaccine shot. Current vaccines are "updated" and protect against the original virus as well as Omicron variants. If you have not yet received an "updated" vaccine, it is recommended. The specifics of whether you need a vaccine update depends on your age, the health of your immune system, what type of vaccine you have already received and when it was given. It is possible that the COVID vaccine could eventually become like the Flu where each year or on a regular basis, a vaccine is developed against current virus variants and then is offered to

people to cover them for that time. Again, talk to your doctor to determine if you are up to date on your COVID shots.

<u>Flu</u>: the CDC recommends that all adults get the Flu vaccine every year. Older people and those with certain chronic medical conditions are at risk of developing sometimes serious Flu-related complications and the Flu vaccine is the best way to reduce this risk. This time of year, the Flu vaccine is readily available in pharmacies, doctor's offices and at Ft. Bliss.

Shingles: Shingles is caused by the chickenpox virus (varicella zoster virus). Most of us had chickenpox as children and after the disease clears, the virus lays dormant in our bodies. As adults, the virus can reactivate causing a shingles rash and can sometimes cause serious complications. The most common location for shingles is on the forehead and may damage the eye or cause chronic pain where the rash was. Two doses of the shingles vaccine (Shingrix) are recommended for everyone age 50 and over and also those ages 19-49 with a weakened immune system. The vaccine is more than 90% effective at preventing shingles and its complications. The vaccine is recommended even if you have already had shingles in the past and if you have received the chicken-pox vaccine. If you need the shingles vaccine, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

<u>Pneumonia</u>: The Pneumococcal vaccine is recommended for those age 65 and older or age 19-64 with certain medical conditions. This vaccine protects against many, but not all types of the pneumococcal bacteria so it is effective but not 100%. The vaccine is safe, but side effects can occur.

<u>Other vaccines</u>: Most people received various vaccines in childhood, but if certain shots were never given, they are recommended in adulthood. The Tdap vaccine covers diphtheria, tetanus, and whooping cough or pertussis. MMR is to prevent measles, mumps and rubella. HepB is for the hepatitis B virus which can infect and damage the liver. All these vaccines can be given to adults if not already received in childhood. RSV is a virus that can cause respiratory disease. If you are over the age of 60, talk to your doctor to see if the RSV vaccine is recommended.
